



Eagle Award for Health and Safety Excellence

Criteria

The Eagle Award for Health and Safety Excellence is based on the ability of a quarry site to maintain a safe and injury-free workplace. The award will be based upon the lowest incidence rate. The award will be based on the results of the preceding MSHA fiscal year. For the 2010 award, the results of the fiscal year ending September 30, 2009 will be used.

In the event of a tie, the location with the lowest total number of S & S citations will be used as the tiebreaker. Eligibility is limited to quarries in operation for a minimum of 9 months during the MSHA fiscal year.

This Eagle Award for Health and Safety Excellence does not replace the GCAA Safety Awards currently presented at the Management Workshop for all locations that have a no lost-time record for the prior calendar year. The Eagle Award for Health and Safety Excellence is awarded to a single site and represents the highest achievement for safety in the previous MSHA fiscal year. It is designed to recognize that the goal for our industry is a zero tolerance for any injury.

There is no submittal necessary for this award. Results will be compiled by GCAA from the published MSHA data to determine the award winner.
